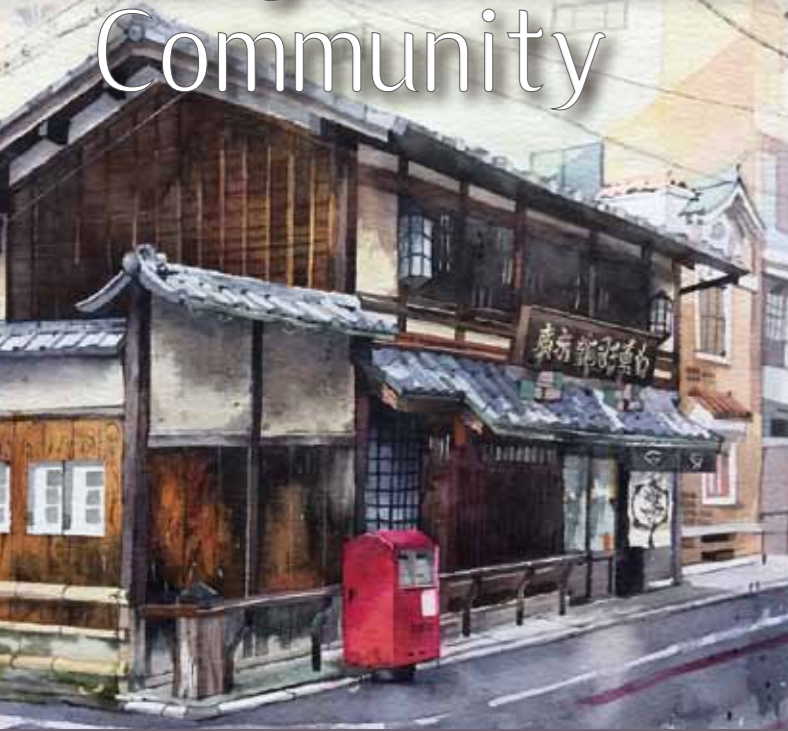


# Welcome to Aneyakouji Neighborhood Community



**Neighborhood Community Development "Machi-zukuri" Vision**

In order to sustain comfortable living environment, Aneyakouji Neighborhood keeps making an effort for years. We created Aneyakouji Neighborhood Community Development (Machi-zukuri) Vision through discussion of what we believe important.

- 1. Community that preserves and develops quiet and calm living atmosphere**
  - Choose appropriate design and colors of building and streetlights that are harmonized with townscape.
- 2. Sustainable community where the residents share the feeling of consideration and live safely and comfortably**
  - Sustain community that allows residents to live safely. Maintain walking-friendly safe roads.
- 3. Community that achieves means of lifestyle, livelihood and culture based on mutual cooperation of neighbors**
  - Maintain good relationships among neighbors through mutual cooperation. Preserve elegant townscape of established Aneyakouji brand.

It is quiet at night as there are no convenience stores inside the Aneyakouji Neighborhood area.

As a rule of "Zone 20", we set speed limit 20km/h for car and bicycle to keep pedestrian safe.

We welcome visitors walking along Aneyakouji street by decorating the street with flowers.

We light up the street with warm-colored electric bulbs.



## Let's take a look at Aneyakouji Neighborhood Community



Aneyakouji Neighborhood district is a historical city area located in the center of Kyoto-city. Lots of residents in this area stay in the same places over 3 to 4 generations. The area still retains calm and quiet streets lined with low-rise detached houses and elegant long-established stores with the wooden signs above their entrance inscribed by famous artists and writers.

In accordance with self-governed building rules known as "Choshikimoku" in the ancient times, people have succeeded spirits and wisdoms of lifestyles by cooperating, being considerate each other, succeeding means of livelihood, and cultivating mind of hospitality "motenashi".



### Let's find "Choshikimoku"



At multiple locations of Aneyakoujiko neighborhood, you can see "komahuda" signs similar to those shown in the above pictures. We re-created modern version of "komahuda" based on Edo era's town rule that was found at one of old houses in the neighborhood.

from subway Imadegawa station: 10-minute walk
- Fushimi Inari-taisha**  
From Keihan electric railway Fushimiinari Station: 10- minute walk
- Nijojo-castle**  
Walk for 20 minutes to Karasuma-Oike station
- Kinkakuji-temple**  
From Kyoto city bus #12 bound for Ritsumeikan Daigaku, Kinkakujimae bus stop
- Arashiyama**  
From "Randen" of Keifuku electric railroad (Arashiyama Main Line and Kitano Line), Arashiyama station
